



Key facts: Samoa

- Samoa is made up of two islands called **Savai'i** and **Upolu**
- The largest island is Savai'i which has an extinct volcano
- Samoa has both white sandy beaches and black volcanic sand beaches
- The thick, dense forests of Samoa are filled with native creatures, such as the flying fox bat and the Samoan land snail
- Tourists visit Samoa to see the world-famous coral reefs and the loggerhead turtles
- The main islands are covered with gorges, waterfalls and lagoons
- The traditional Samoan dance is called the Siva
- The people of Samoa have been sailing between the islands of Polynesia for around 4,000 years!
