







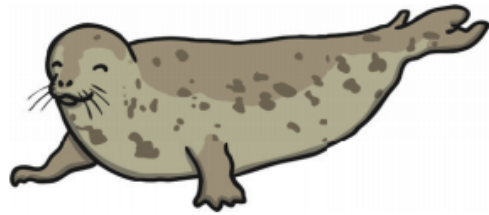
### Key facts: the Arctic

- The Arctic has very few plants because it is very cold there.
- The land masses are made of ice and there are icebergs in the ocean.
- There are two kinds of fox and hare in the Arctic and they are called the Arctic Fox and Arctic Hare
- Animals like a Walrus and Orca (Killer Whale) live in the ocean around the North Pole
- People live in the Arctic and their houses are raised on stilts to protect from floods.

### Key facts: the Antarctic

- The Antarctic is at the bottom of the world, at the South Pole.
- The Antarctic covers the continent of Antarctica and has lots of ice and some islands.
- Most of the land is covered by snow and ice. There are also icebergs in the water.
- It is the coldest place in the world.
- Special animals live there, including penguins, seals and killer whales.
- No people live in the Antarctic but some scientists visit there to carry out special tests, investigations and research.

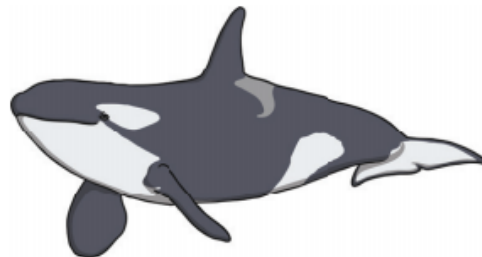
