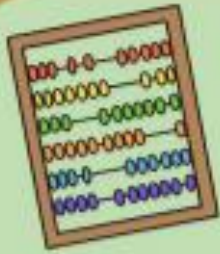

Key facts: Victorian England

- The Victorians were the people who lived during the reign of Queen Victoria, from the 20 June 1837 until the date of her death on the 22 January 1901.
- New inventions, like the telephone, motorcar, typewriter, bicycle and moving film totally changed the way that people lived, worked and travelled.
- Victorian children were expected to work long hours and for less money than adults. To make matters worse, the jobs were often dangerous and conditions were hard. Children were favoured because they could fit into tight spaces that adults couldn't. Therefore, many children worked in factories, coal mines and as chimney sweeps.
- Queen Victoria believed that education should be for all, and by the end of her reign, going to school became compulsory for all children, rich or poor.



Victorian School Class Rules



1. Students must stand up to answer questions and wait for permission to speak.
2. Students must call teachers "Sir" or "Miss" or "Mrs".
3. Students must stand when an adult enters the room.
4. Students must use the right hand at all times for writing.
5. Girls will learn needlework and boys will learn technical drawing.
6. Students must not put their hands up unless told they can do so.
7. Students must not ask questions.
8. Talking and fidgeting will be punished.
9. Children who are truant (late), behave badly or do poor work will be caned.
