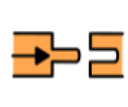

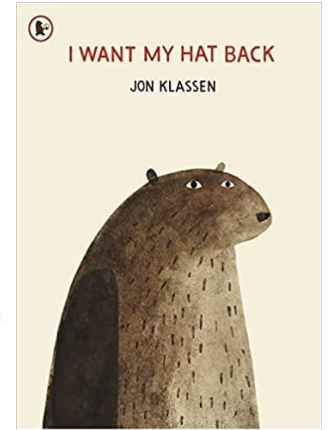

- Omnivores are animals that eat both meat and plants to live. For example, humans, raccoons, badgers and most bears are omnivores.
