### Key facts: the savannah

- Almost half of Africa is a savannah. A savannah is a place which is mostly grass and has a few trees.
- It is a place which has a season of really dry weather and then a very wet season which helps the grass and other plants to grow.
- The savannah is warm all year long, this is because it is so close to the equator, which is the imaginary line around the middle of the earth.
- The savannah is full of herbivores (animals that eat plants) and carnivores (animals that eat other animals).
- Herbivores in the savannah have special traits to keep themselves safe from carnivores, these include spines, tusks, stripes or being very tall and large.
- Animals in the savannah have different methods of camouflage which helps them to blend into the savannah so predators or carnivores cannot catch them and eat them.
