### Key facts: seas surrounding the United Kingdom

- There are three different seas surrounding the United Kingdom: The North Sea, the English Channel and the Irish Sea.
- The North Sea is part of the Atlantic Ocean. The North Sea located between Norway and Denmark in the east, Scotland and England in the west and Germany, the Netherlands, Belgium and France in the south.
- The North Sea is more than 600 miles long and 360 miles wide.
- The English Channel separates England from France. The narrowest point of the English Channel is the Straits of Dover measuring only 33 kilometres which is equal to about 20 miles.
- People can use the Channel Tunnel to travel between England and Europe.
- The Irish Sea separates Ireland from England and Wales. In the middle of the sea is the Isle of Man.
- At its deepest point, the Irish Sea is about 300 metres deep.
